In accordance with the Motorcycling Western Australia Constitution, "notices of motion" for general business at the Annual General Meeting must be forwarded in writing by the Secretary of an affiliated club and must be received by the Chief Executive Officer by close of business 1 March 2017. "Notices of motion" will only be heard that relate to the matters contained or referred to in the Constitution, Rules, Standing Orders, or By-Laws of the Association.

2. **NOMINATIONS FOR DIRECTOR**

Nominations for Director must be lodged in writing and received by the Executive Director by close of business 1 March 2017. All nominees must be seconded by a delegate of the Council. Note new constitutional requirements: For 2016, Council will elect three Directors only. Two Directors will be appointed for a three year term. One Director with the least votes will be elected for a two year term. For 2017 the same conditions for election will apply. From 2018 on, two directors per year will be elected for three year terms. The President and Vice President will be elected by the Board at their first board meeting.

Nominations for Sporting Panels will be made to the MWA board. A list of prospective new members will be circulated to clubs prior to being appointed by the board.

7 AGENDA ITEMS

7.1 Overview of Board Activities

President gave a verbal report on the activities of the board, including:

- Re-election of President Peter Clark and Vice President Tracy Simpson
- Review of governance policies
- Whole of Sport Review – input into ongoing process of change at MA/States
- Work continues on a state owned motorcycle park. Still early days with no site finalised.
- Assisted Speedway with a loan if required to assist purchase safety fence
- Affiliated Kimberley Enduro Club and Jerramungup MX Club
- Continue to work with DSR regards Barbagallo review
- Resolved not to move the Lightweight Junior or Senior dates
- Met with MX panel to discuss issues

In addition progress continues on major initiative including FairGo – Moto, a program for kids with disabilities, Minikhana and MotoSafe schools programs.

MWA were proud to announce that the Women’s Program led by Tracy Simpson and the Women’s Committee was the recipient of a prestigious industry award – Women is Sport – at the recent Dept Sport and Recreation Industry awards, ahead of the Perth Lynx and the WACA programs.

7.2 Overview of Whole of Sport Review

This summary was deferred until the next meeting of Council, likely to be a Presidents Forum to discuss the state of the sport on a date to be determined.

7.3 Summary of requirements to comply with new Incorporations Act

CEO presented a summary of what is required to comply with the new incorporation act. Clubs have 3 years to comply, the committee can apply to the department of Commerce direct without going to a Special General Meeting for changes provided these are only changes necessary for their constitution to comply. MWA is able to assist with model constitutions, or clubs can use the Department Model Rules.

7.4 Presentation on insurance by AON and MAIL representatives

John Bolitho, Richard Thomas and Brendan Wright gave a presentation on the various insurances maintained through affiliation with MA.

John gave a history of MAIL, the MA captive insurer

Brendan gave an overview of the Group Personal Accident Insurance, what was covered and what was not, the public liability and what must be referred to AON.

Richard provided an overview of the claims process. A copy of the presentation has been sent to all clubs and is on the MWA website.

In summary the key messages from the combined presentation were:

- Good risk management is essential and is the way of the future, especially around venues and events. MWA has a framework for clubs to adopt.
- Strict adherence to MA/MWA procedures
 - Permits in place for all activity no exception
 - All riders licenced
 - Proper supervision
 - Appropriate medical and emergency procedures for the level of event.
- Reporting- accurate, complete and timely
- Early notification to MWA and Insurer
- If in doubt call MWA/AON/Proclaim

7.5 LATE ITEM: Update on Working With Children

CEO gave an overview of Working With Children checks. There is a serious concern that clubs are generally lacking in adhering to the legislation which has been around for 10 years now. MWA have provided much documentation and assistance however it is up to clubs to implement as clubs and volunteer members are at risk of significant penalties for non-compliance. A less tolerant approach is to be taken with clubs that do not comply.

A question and answer session followed with an overview of what is required. Generally it is not an onerous task to comply. Concern was raised that the WWC checks had a number of 'loopholes'. CEO explained that WWC checks should only be one of several procedures being put in place to more fully protect children. There will be a dedicated section of the MWA website for WWC checks and other actions that can be taken to look after the interests of children in our care.

In this climate driven by the national economic downturn we need to be more pro-active at all levels – MA/ MWA/ Club to ensure riders continue to be attracted to our sport.

Aim of the ‘Stronger Clubs – Stronger Motorcycling’ Forum.

To listen to your ideas to improve participation from riders, officials and volunteers

The forum considered four main topics: clubs, events, MWA/MA and other influences. After workshop sessions that arrived at a number of alternatives for action these were prioritised.

The sport was well represented across all disciplines, with junior clubs, metro and regional clubs present.

The prioritised actions were (number of stars* reflect the group vote):

Events:

- ***** Make the event an EVENT, such as tradeshows, bands, and other attractions
- ***** Have cross discipline events such as Dirt Track events at an MX event
- ** Run more non-competitive fun events such as GoMoto,
- ** Run events with different formats such as handicap races
- ** have a shared resource for officials
- . * Spread out the season
- Have entry on the day but encourage online entries with early bird entries
- Better advertising (signage on road side etc)

Clubs:

- *** Ownership of clubs. Mentoring of committee members, succession planning etc to avoid new committees having to reinvent the wheel each year.
- ** Job descriptions – handovers.
- ** Meeting more regularly as a club on a social basis, make general meetings more social
- . * Venues more social ie meals etc
- Lower cost of family membership
- Widening of financial resources. More income streams other than memberships
- Review membership skill base of committees

MWA/MA

- ***** Licence cost in general is too expensive
- ***** MA look at event software with support for event management (inc tech support on weekends)
- ***** Change rules so race secretaries in MX are able to ride with COC permission. Needs to be consistent between disciplines.
- ***** Recognition of officials.
- **** Run DSR courses at MWA, or promote awareness of courses regards volunteers, coordination and management.
- **** Calendar on MWA website to cover all clubs and all events, club through national
- **** Better pathways for officials from level 0 to 4
- **** Reduce complexity in training and grading of officials, current complex system results in lack of officials (from L1 to L4 too many steps)
- *** Officials wanting to go from L2 to L3 or L3 to L4, not enough events available – need other process or other options
- . * Ideas for MA/MWA need follow up
- . * MoMS, require standardising. Less frequent changes (every 3 years). Commissions should not be submitting rule changes.
- Assessment process for officials upgrades.

Other

- ***** How to promote the sport in the media
- **** Run first aid courses at MWA, or at clubs
- . * There is too much liability on Practice Supervisors, return to old system.
- . * Do we have too many clubs, should there be mergers?
- . * Difficulty in retaining competition members
- Environmental issue. Standardise noise levels across disciplines

Position Description – Board Director

About the Board of Motorcycling Western Australia

The business of Motorcycling Western Australia Inc is managed by the CEO and staff of MWA under direction of the Board. The Board is also responsible for acting on all policy and finance issues and must act collectively in a way which is mutually beneficial to MWA, the Members, the sport of motorcycling and the general community throughout Western Australia.

The Board is responsible for the appointment of a CEO who must do all things necessary for the proper management and administration of MWA. The CEO is accountable to the Board via the President.

The Board is also advised by a number of sports advisory panels. The Sporting Panel Chairman and his/her panel members are accountable and responsible to the Board.

Composition

- Up to 6 Directors elected by Members
- Up to 2 other Directors elected by the 6 elected Directors

Appointment

The six Directors are elected by the Council of Motorcycling Western Australia for a three year term, with two retiring each year. Two Directors are appointed by the six elected Directors if required based on the board skills and to ensure a cross representation of skills.

Note: the board at the first meeting after the AGM will elect the president and vice president.

Responsibilities and Duties

Directors:

- Should be able to identify issues of significance to the Board and/or Council
- Should contribute to the right environment for discussion at meetings and allow all members equal opportunity to have their views heard.
- Must act at all times within Motorcycling Western Australia rules and policies, including those of Motorcycling Australia and the GCR's.
- Must strive to ensure that Motorcycling Western Australia develops to its full potential
- Should be willing to serve on other committees as required
- Must always act in the interest of MWA and the Members
- Must avoid conflicts of interest

Skill Base

The Board should consist of individuals who have the necessary qualifications and skills to control the Association. Directors should bring to the Board knowledge, experience and influence in one or more of the following areas:

- Knowledge of the Sport as either a competitor, an administrator or an official
- Experience in strategic planning
- Business management
- Organisation management skill
- Legal expertise
- Marketing and Public relations
- Government Relations experience
- Finance
- Networks or contacts

Position Description – Sporting Panel Member

About the Sporting Panels of Motorcycling Western Australia

The business of Motorcycling Western Australia Inc is managed by the CEO and staff of MWA under direction of the Board. The Board is also responsible for acting on all policy and finance issues and must act collectively in a way which is mutually beneficial to MWA, the Members, the sport of motorcycling and the general community throughout Western Australia.

The Board is also advised by a number of sports advisory panels. The Sporting Panel Chairman and his/her panel members are accountable and responsible to the Board. The Board or Motorcycling Western Australia office may request advice from a Sporting Panel, or a Sporting Panel may refer matters identified as issues or development opportunities to the Board or Motorcycling Western Australia office.

Reporting to the Board is through minutes or in writing through the CEO, or in person by invitation to Board meetings.

Sporting Panels may be delegated powers by the Board.

Composition

- 4 – 6 members selected by MWA board

Appointment

Sporting Panel members are selected for a two year term with half retiring in alternate years to provide continuity.

Responsibilities and Duties

Sporting Panel members should:

- Be able to identify issues of significance to the Board.
- Contribute to the right environment for discussion at meetings and allow all members equal opportunity to have their views heard.
- Act at all times within Motorcycling Western Australia rules and policies, including those of Motorcycling Australia and the GCR's.
- Strive to ensure that Motorcycling Western Australia and their sport develops to its full potential
- Be active, impartial, forward thinking and more often than not “act” rather than “react”. Personal agendas must be set aside as the best interests of Motorcycle Sport in WA and MWA are paramount
- Recommend actions on matters referred to it and initiate recommendations for the betterment of the sport.
- Meet regularly (preferably monthly) and provide the MWA Board with minutes of these meetings by the end of each month so they can be considered at the next Board meeting.

Skill Base

Sporting Panel members should consist of individuals who have the necessary qualifications and skills to contribute to their development of their sport. Sporting Panel members should bring to the Panel knowledge, experience and influence in one or more of the following areas:

- Knowledge of the Sport as either a competitor, an administrator or an official
- Experience in strategic planning
- Business management
- Organization management skill
- Legal expertise
- Marketing and Public relations
- Government Relations experience
- Finance
- Networks or contacts

What Sporting Panels do

- Develop and forward Championship Regulations for approval by the Board by November.
- Provide input into the MWA Strategic Plan.
- As a priority develop strategies for the growth of their particular sport.
- Provide advice on technical rules and their application to promote fair and safe motorcycling.
- Provide input into the MWA calendar, recommend clubs to conduct state championships. Work with the CEO and other Sports to complete by end of November.
- Implement and review a fair and equitable grading process
- Provide the MWA office with grading lists.
- Advise on supplementary regulations.
- Provide advice to the Board
- Sporting Panels are expected to:
 - Contribute throughout the year, not just when meetings are held.
 - Be dynamic and innovative for the benefit of the sport.
 - Work for the sport state wide. Parochial or club based views are unacceptable.
 - Once a majority decision has been reached all Panel members are expected to show solidarity and publicly support the Panel decision.

Sporting Panel Restrictions

- Unless Panel members are appointed specifically as an official at an event they have no authority at it. If asked for input as a Sporting Panel member it may only be to the Steward or Clerk of Course.
- Sporting Panels cannot change GCR's but may make recommendations to MWA seeking changes to the rules. These recommendations should focus on the MA Commission meetings in each year so that the proposal can be properly passed through the MA system.
- To streamline communication, responses to draft minutes, Supplementary Regulations etc are to be directed to the MWA office who will distribute to the Sporting Panel.
