## BY-LAW 1

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### **MWA STATE CALENDAR OF MOTORCYCLE EVENTS** **- CRITERIA FOR ALLOCATION OF EVENT DATES**

The Board will determine the final date that applications will be received for open and special interclub event calendar dates for the following year. Clubs and promoters will be advised in writing.

The allocation of calendar dates will be based in principle on a priority of event status based on the following order:

- a/ International
  - b/ National Championships
  - c/ State Championships
  - d/ National Events
  - e/ Other Events
1. Clubs/promoters must submit a written application stating their preference for a date plus an alternative date if the first option is not available. Contained within the written application must be supporting approvals regarding venue approval for those venues not contained within the register on MWA approved venues.
  2. The calendar date application fee, if any, will be determined by the Board of MWA prior to requesting applications.
    - a. This fee will be deductible from the event fees if the event proceeds.
    - b. Applications submitted without the required fee (if applicable) will not be considered.
  3. Late applications may be considered but must be accompanied by a late application fee.
    - a. The late application fee will be determined by the Management of MWA prior to requesting applications.
    - b. Late application fees will not be deductible.
  4. Late applications shall not take precedence over an event already listed.
  5. Should an event be cancelled for any reason after being accepted on the final calendar draft, then a cancellation fee will apply.
    - a. This fee will be half of the permit fee payable to MWA.
  6. The MWA Administrator shall prepare a draft of the calendar incorporating all applications which will be circulated to the relevant sub-committees for a preliminary draft.
  7. After receiving the comment from clubs each sub-committee is to table to Board their recommendation for the allocation of calendar dates pertaining to their discipline. The deadline for this will be determined and advised by Board.
  8. Every effort will be made to rationalise the calendar to avoid clashes of events, especially in the same vicinity or of the same discipline. However, each application will be judged on its own merits and a logical approach must be demonstrated by each committee.
  9. Events approved shall not be date changed without prior approval of Board.
  10. The Board will determine the final draft.

## 11. Issue of Permits:

The following shall apply to the issue of permits.

1. National Championship events within WA: No further competition permits will be issued within that discipline on that date.
2. State championship events: Junior and Senior State Championship events in the same discipline cannot compete against each other.

Closed to Club competitions may be held under the following conditions:

### Within a 150 km distance by road from a State Championship event

For a senior State Event: Junior closed to Club permits can be issued

For a junior State Event: Senior closed to club permits can be issued.

### Over a 150km distance by road from a State Championship Event

Closed to club permits for junior and senior events can be issued.

3. Open Events: Closed to club and interclub permits for junior and senior events can be issued.

For the purpose of Item 11.1 of this bylaw Junior MX, MX and Vintage MX are considered the same discipline.

For the purpose of Items 11.2 and 11.3 of this bylaw Junior MX and MX are considered the same discipline and Vintage MX a separate discipline."

Clubs may apply to the Board for an exemption to this by-law for exceptional circumstances

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
