## BY LAW 9

### **CRITERIA FOR INTERCLUB PERMITS - BY LAW**

*Adopted: October Council Meeting 1994*

*Amended: November Council Meeting 2004*

The following criteria apply to clubs in applying for interclub permits. Clubs may nominate which type of interclub required for an event on the appropriate 'application for permit' form. Management reserves the right to re-determine the status of any application.

#### **1. Basic Interclub:**

1. Limit of 3 clubs (metro or country)
2. Participants must be a bona-fide member of one of the clubs nominated in the application and according to club constitution. 'Day' or other time limited memberships are not permitted.
3. Cannot be part of a series (excepting as part of an individual club's series)
4. Cannot declare a champion or title (except for club champion).
5. Officials. Club appoints Level 2

#### **2. Regional Interclub**

1. Region boundaries as set by Management.
2. Limited to clubs within the region. Exceptions with permission of Management.
3. Participants must be a bona-fide member of one of the clubs nominated in the application and according to club constitution. 'Day' or other time limited memberships are not permitted.
4. May declare a region champion only. Examples: North West Region Champion, South West Region Champion, Metro Region Champion, Mid West Region Champion, Goldfields Region Champion.
5. May form part of an individual club's series
6. Officials. Club appoints Level 2.

#### **3. Special Interclub**

1. No limits on number of clubs
2. Participants must be a bona-fide member of a Western Australian club according to club constitution. 'Day' or other time limited memberships are not permitted.
3. No state championship or title status.
4. May form part of a series and a series champion may be declared.
5. May form part of an individual club's series
6. Officials. Level 3 Steward may be appointed by MWA. Club appoints other Level 3.
7. Must appear on the MWA calendar and be part of the calendar date application process to aid planning.
