VENUE	Collie Motorplex, Powerhouse Road, Collie Long Track – Circuit distance being approximately 2.55 km. Racing will be in an anticlockwise direction (Left hand inwards).

ENTRIES:	Entry is open to holders of current National Competition Licenses issued by M.A. and its LCB's. Riders must be financial members of an MA affiliated club.		
	The Promoter reserves the right to reject any entry or grade riders, also to delete, alter or vary events in program on the day, subject to the approval of the Clerk of Course / Steward of Meeting.  Entry is online via Ridernet (Link available at the MCRCWA Website)  Entries close FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 27  Refer to the 2024 Road Race Regulations for entry cancellations, minimum entries and medical clearance requirements.

VENUE ENTRY	Gates open at 6:15 am Sunday		
	Camping is available Friday and Saturday night. Access to the Campsite and Pit Paddock area may be restricted until track is not in use. Refer to the final instructions.		
	Pit Paddock and campsite entry is via the tunnel. Tunnel height limit is 2.4 meters. Over height vehicles may only access the infield facilities prior to commencement of any on-track activity, or at the conclusion of all on track activities.		
	Children 16 years and under must be accompanied by an adult.		
	Children must be supervised, by an adult, at all times.		
PIT PADDOCK	The Pit paddock area has specific riding and walking lanes, please adhere to them. Speed Limit in paddock area is 15 kms.		
	Enclosed footwear must be worn at all times.		
	No vehicle access for re loading until the conclusion of the final race event.		
	No Dogs (other than guide dogs and Assistant animals) Frisbees, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, pushbikes, minibikes, drones or balls are allowed in the whole of the pit paddock, dummy grid or pit lane areas.		
PIT ALLOCATIONS	Powered Carports are included in the entry fee and are <b>pre-allocated</b> . Covered bays are powered by an onsite generator, open air bays are not powered and competitors will be required to bring their own generator power.

	All electrical equipment must comply with Workplace Safety requirements. MCRCWA take no responsibility for competitors' equipment not meeting Australian Standards or the Occupational Health and Safety Act.		
	Any competitor considering to provide their own structure/shelter, must first make application to the Secretary of the Meeting for approval by the Promoter, no less than 1 week prior the meeting. If permission is given, it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure all Occupational Health & Safety, and Australian Engineering Standards are met.		
SMOKING	For safety reasons, smoking is not permitted in any of the pit bays, garages, Pit Paddock, Pit Lane or at the Riders Briefing. This applies to all competitors, their crew members and guests.		
SIGN-ON AND DOCUMENTATION CHECKS	Prior to attending scrutineering & any on-track activities, competitors are required to attend the Race Admin Office to sign the Participation Waiver Agreement.		
	The parent or guardian of a junior rider must also sign on & complete the Waiver.		
	Parents or guardians must attend the event. Guardians must be nominated a minimum of the Thursday Prior by notifying the club in writing.

	Attendance sheet before leaving the Briefing. There will be no scrutineering during the Briefing.

	All competitors must set a timed practice lap per class they have entered to be eligible to compete. The Clerk of Course will have the authority to alter or vary as required. No rider will be permitted to practice in any other but his or her allocated sessions without prior permission from the Clerk of Course.
