2. Jurisdiction

- 2.1 The abovementioned event has been authorised by Motorcycling WA which has issued Motorcycling WA Permit Number: SP/24/C/13878 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Junior National or Australia Senior National or One event competition Licences.
- 2.2 The event will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCR's), these Supplementary Regulations, MA Policies, and any final instructions approved by MWA. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with such rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

4. Entries

- 4.1 Entries are now open and close at Midnight (local WA time) on Friday 27th September 2024. **No Late Entries** accepted.
- 4.2 Entries are only accepted via Ridernet Online.
- 4.3 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Promoter or riders may be offered a refund.
- 4.4 Entry fees will only be refunded if a rider informs SMCWA in writing 7 days before the event. A medical certificate is required if rider withdraws less than 7 days before event.
- 4.5 It is the responsibility of the Competitor to ensure their Ridernet profile is up to date.

5. Entry Fee

5.1 All entries are via Ridernet – www.ridernet.com.au

- The entry fee is **Juniors \$30.00 per rider and Seniors \$50.00 per rider. Class fee is \$10.00 per rider.** (Senior Riders must either have a registered Transponder or select to pay Transponder Hire under the Products section of the entry form)
- 5.2 Payment by online entry via Ridernet only.
- 5.3 Transponders are compulsory. They are the responsibility of the competitor and must be returned at the completion of the event.

6. Insurance

- 6.1 Those who hold an MA licence current for the duration of the Event, and Officials, who are signed on for the Event are covered by MA's National Personal Accident Scheme which provides basic cover for rehabilitation expenses and death and permanent disability benefits. For more information see <u>Insurance Motorcycling</u> <u>Australia (ma.org.au)</u>
- 6.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licences and must be maintained for the duration of your licence. It is strongly recommended that competitors consider taking out weekly benefits insurance.

7. Medical Services

Absolute Medical Response (AMR) Ambulance services including Paramedics will be in attendance for all practice and racing sessions, in accordance with the requirements of Motorcycling Australia.

Riders or Sidecar passengers who have been transported to hospital by Ambulance or personal vehicle, **must** obtain a medical clearance to the effect that they are fit to resume/continue competition motorcycle racing. This clearance is to be produced on request at their next race event. This also applies to a rider/passenger if they return to the same race event after transportation to hospital.

8. Scrutineering

Scrutineering will commence at 2.30pm and closes at 4.30pm.

JUNIORS SCRUTINEERING IS 2.30PM TO 3.00PM SENIORS SCRUTINEERING IS 3.00PM TO 4.30PM DON'T BE LATE AS REFUSAL TO RIDE MAY OFFEND

Machinery entered in the event must have successfully passed a machine examination prior to taking part in any practice, qualifying or racing. A scrutineering decal will be placed on the front of the machine to indicate the machine has been successfully examined.

Helmet/s must be presented at scrutineering.

Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the event.

12.10.6 Measurements: ALL Australian and State Championship Events.

12.10.6.1 All machines must have provision for the placement of sealing wire.

12.10.6.2 An entrant may request that the entrant's machine be measured and sealed before the event. As soon as practicable after receiving the request the measurer for the event must measure and seal the machine. Any machine examined under this sub-rule may, on application by entrant, at the discretion of the measurer, be exempted from further examination at the event.

12.10.6.4 Any machine sealed as the result of a protest may only be measured by a measurer. All measurer's reports, together with the seals, must be delivered to the RCB within 21 days after the event.

12.10.6.5 No prize monies may be until measurer's reports and seals are received or the expiration of 21 days whichever occurs first.

Enclosed footwear MUST be worn at all times. Refer to section: Pg 248/Number 3 of Appendix A.

10. Entries – Constitute a Class

10.1 To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining Championship status, the number of competitors entered and competing in each class shall be:

10.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition by Sunday 29th September (midnight), the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards will be at the discretion of the Promoter.

12.	Race Format
For th	ne SMCWA Rod Slater Super Series:

• The event will be run depending on the numbers of competitors nominating for Solo and Sidecars and this will reflect in the number of heats that will be run.

- Flat Track heats will depend on the number of competitors nominated and will be a maximum of 8 riders per heat
- ALL heats for Solos and Sidecars will be over four (4) laps. Finals will also be over four (4) Laps. Flat Track heats will be over four (4) laps and the final will be over six (6) laps.
- Scoring will be as Per GCR's

FINALS For Solos and Sidecars

A Final

The top three-point scorers will go direct to the A Final plus the Winner of the B final. The place getters in this Final will determine who is 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th in this event.

B Final

The riders for the B Final will be the 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th point scorers.

The winner of the B final will go to the A Final, 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 4^{th} in this final will determine who 5^{th} , 6^{th} and 7^{th} in this event.

• If rider's tie-on points for the A or B finals, the count back system will determine any ties.

FINALS For Flat Tracks

For Flat Track Senior:

A Final

The Final is made up of the six riders accumulating the highest number of points during the course of the heats plus the first two placings of the repechage. The final will be over six (6) laps.

B Final

Next eight riders (Riders 7 - 14) accumulating the highest number of points during the heats compete the repechage.

16.3	A change of machinery is allowed but the machine must be scrutineered and has passed scrutineering. The Clerk of Course must be advised.	
17.	Riding Numbers	
17.1	Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. All others will be allocated numbers at the Promoters discretion.	
17.2	ALL number plates on machines MUST comply with the GCR's and must not contain any decals or advertising other than the required decal. (Refer to section: 12.9.1.2)

19.	Rider's briefing	
	A rider's briefing will be held prior to the commencement of the practice/racing, which ALL competitors and	
	Parents/Guardians of Juniors MUST attend. At the completion of the briefing all competitors/parents/guardians must sign the sign on sheet.	
	Non-attendance at the Rider's briefing may result in a penalty being applied.

20.	Circuit description The circuit is 330m with clay and diorite mix/142m with clay and diorite mix.
21. 21.1	Track Inspection All competitors will be given an opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the track at this time.
21.2	<u>Track Dissatisfaction</u> : Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspect of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of Course. If the concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the event.
