CLUBMAN 2025 NOVICE & D GRADE ENTRY	This Novice class is open to current Novice and D Grade riders and to machines from 601cc to 1000cc 4-cylinder bikes and 751cc to 1300cc 2/3-cylinder bikes, for Clubman 1000, and machines up to 600cc 4-cylinder bikes, 750cc 2-cylinder bikes and 675cc 3-cylinder bikes.		
LEVEL ELIGIBILITY	It is recommended that bikes are compliant to either the Superbike or Supersport State Championship regulations as competitors are encouraged to cross-enter as riders meet C-grade, as they may be regraded out of this class during season.		
	The Promotor reserves the right to review and/or reject entries to this Novice Series.		
	Riders and machines must comply with the relevant Clubman 1000 or Clubman 600 class regulations.		
BRITISH, EUROPEAN, AMERICAN.	The Series will be open to all senior riders with machines eligible for the BEARS Classes. The promoter reserves the right to review and add/reject entries to this Series.  Riders & machines must comply with GCR MOMS 6C and 6D, along with the BEARS Formula 1 or BEARS Formula 2 class regulations as below:

PIT PADDOCK	The Pit paddock area has specific riding and walking lanes, please adhere to them. Speed Limit in paddock area is 15 kms.

	No Dogs (other than guide dogs and Assistant animals) Frisbees, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, pushbikes, minibikes, drones or balls are allowed in the whole of the pit paddock, dummy grid or pit lane areas.		
PIT ALLOCATIONS	Powered Carports are included in the entry fee and are <b>pre-allocated</b> . Pit bays in use are the Outside pits.

	All electrical equipment must comply with Workplace Safety requirements. MCRCWA take no responsibility for competitors' equipment not meeting Australian Standards or the Occupational Health and Safety Act.		
	Any competitor considering providing their own structure/shelter, must first make application to the Secretary of the Meeting for approval by the Promoter, no less than 1 week prior the meeting. If permission is given, it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure all Occupational Health & Safety, and Australian Engineering Standards are met.

SIGN-ON AND DOCUMENTATION CHECKS	Prior to attending scrutineering & any on-track activities, competitors are required to attend the Race Admin Office to sign the Waiver Agreement and present current MA Licence.		
CILCAS	Virtual licences will be accepted. Download the MA App via MA APP Download login with your Ridernet ID		
	( Licence Number) and Choose Virtual Licence.		
	MA Senior National Licences and MA Junior National Licences with the required endorsement are required.		
	Parent or nominated guardian of riders under 18 are required to be present to co-sign for the rider.		
	The parent or guardian of a junior rider must also sign on & complete the Waiver. Guardians must be nominated a minimum of the Thursday Prior by notifying the club in writing.		
CREW LICENCES (NEW 2025)	Crew members who wish to access the Pit Lane and or Signal wall are required to Sign on, take ou Crew Licence (available from the race admin office at \$29 for a one event licence). Once signed an licensed a "wrist band" will be issued to the crew member for access.		
	Annual Crew Licences at \$83 can be purchased thru Ridernet.		
Air Fence Set-up	All classes of riders (crew are welcome) are <u>required</u> to assist with the set up early morning and pack-up at the conclusion of the final race.		
	Additional trailers and cars will greatly reduce how long this takes.

TECHNICAL	Technical inspections will take place at the "green" scrutineering shed from <b>7.00am</b> to <b>9.30am</b> on the day.

DETAILS	Reminder: All machines require lock-wired calliper mounting bolts and only non-glycol coolants may be used.		
RIDERS BRIEFING	Riders Briefing will be held at <b>8.15am on the main grid for Round 1</b> to provide information on start lights and grid marking positions.

PRACTICE	From <b>9.00am</b> on the day.		
QUALIFING &	<b>Two</b> combined practice/qualifying sessions per group will be held prior to racing to determine grid positions for Race 1 of round 1.		
GRIDS	All competitors must set a timed lap during practice(or qualifying session) on the day to be eligible to compete. The Clerk of Course will have the authority to alter or vary as required. No rider will be permitted to practice in any other but his or her allocated sessions without prior permission from the Clerk of Course.		
STARTING POSITIONS	Grid positions for Round 1, race one of each class will be determined by qualifying.  Remaining legs will be as per finishing order of the previous race (ie progressive).		
	For all remaining rounds Leg 1 will start as per finishing order of the final leg of previous round.		
RIDING OF	The riding of Competition machines in Pit Paddock <b>must</b> be in the designated bike lane only and at no		
MACHINES	more than 15kms. Penalties may be imposed. All riders <b>must</b> wear a helmet.		
	The Pit Lane/Dummy Grid speed limit is 40 km/hr.		
RACE NUMBERS	Competitors are to refer to the 2025 WA Road Racing and WA Junior Road Racing Championship Regulations for Race Number technical requirements.		
	Competitors are to use their Road Race MWA approved and allocated race numbers. Competitors may request to use alternate numbers (i.e. an MWA allocated number from an alternate discipline) these require written approval from the promoter and approval is on a case by case basis.

## TURN 3 CHICANE

Competitors leaving the track at the chicane onto the run-off at turn 3 chicane must come to a complete stop prior to re-entering the circuit.




Figure 1- Chicane Diagram

<u>Exceeding track limits:</u> Competitors crossing onto the bitumen area indicated by the "No-Go" (hashed red) zone in Figure 1 will be penalised by the Clerk of Course. This may be monitored via marshals and video recording. The penalties are 15 seconds for breaches.

# TURN 7 RIPPLE STRIP

Competitors leaving the track to the rear of the ripple strip, situated at riders left at Turn 7 <u>must not</u> return directly to the track. Competitors **must** proceed down Pit Lane (Dummy grid) at less than 40 km/hr and rejoin the event from the pit lane exit at the entry to Turn 1.

Failure to ride down Pit Lane prior to re-entry will result in the competitor being penalised as below.

- Failing to follow this procedure in practice will be a \$100 fine.
- Failing to follow this procedure in Qualifying will be the loss of qualifying times for that session.
- Failing to follow this procedure in races will be the incurrence of a 30 second time penalty.

#### **POINT SCORES**

Points will be scored as per championship regulations and series supplementary regulations. As per GCR 6.12.16.
